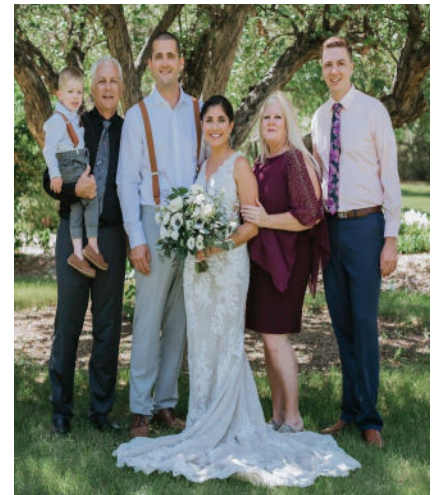

Graduation 2024

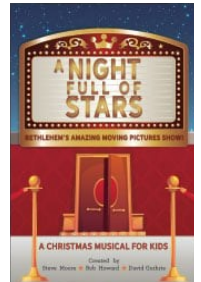

 - * 2 students ran 8 or more miles.



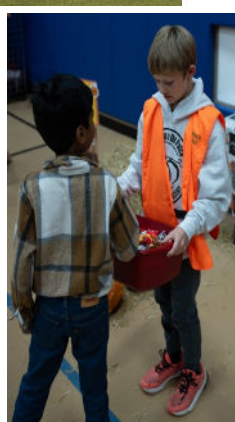
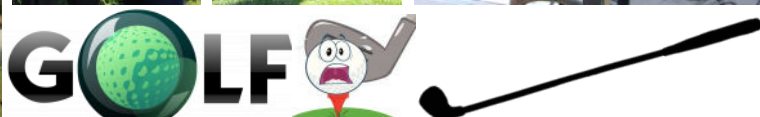
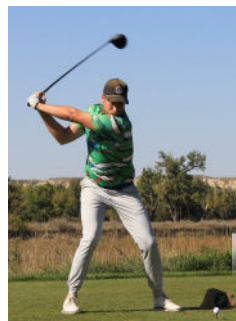
2023 Fall Fundraising
