Keepers of the Kingdom

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TRANSITIONAL MEMBER This entire year we have been focusing on the kingdom of God during chapel, and what it means to be "keepers of the kingdom." A natural question I ask every chapel message is, "Who is the King of the kingdom?" By now, the students will respond correctly by saying, "Jesus Christ." I ask them to give me a verse that supports this and their response is Mathew 28:18:

"Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me.'"

God the Father has given His Son all authority in heaven and on earth. Well then, how do we become part of His kingdom?

Romans 10:9-10 says, "if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead you will be saved."

Becoming part of the kingdom involves giving heart allegiance to the King of heaven and earth, Jesus Christ. The next big question is how do we live during our time on earth, to be keepers of the kingdom? King Jesus summed up the commandments in Mark 12:28-31:

["]One of the scribes came and heard them arguing, and recognizing that He had answered them well, asked Him, 'What commandment is the foremost of all?'" Jesus answered, "The foremost is, Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is one Lord; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.'" The second is this, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

Finally, how do we bring our children up in the instruction of the King in a way that they will live virtuous lives in His kingdom and advance His kingdom on earth? The answer is providing a Biblical education for our students as we partner with their parents to fulfill this obligation.

HCA Transitions Toward Classical Learning Approach

HCA Transitioning Toward Classical Christian Learning Approach

Classical refers to the traditional approach to education, an approach common before the twentieth century that was cultivated by the church, grounded in piety, and governed by theology. Classical education uses the historic curriculum and teaching methods of the seven liberal arts (grammar, logic, rhetoric, arithmetic, geometry, astronomy, and music) in order to form men and women characterized by wisdom, virtue, and eloquence.

Classical also refers to the educational insights that Dorothy Sayers made in her essay "The Lost Tools of Learning." She observed that students tend to learn in stages that correspond to the subject matter of the first three liberal arts (grammar, logic, and rhetoric).

In the **Grammar** stage (elementary), students like to sing, chant, and recite. They like to learn the "facts" or the "grammar" of various subjects such as history, science, geography, math, and music. The Grammar stage is a very musical stage. It is the stage where students wonder at creation, delight in imitation, and learn through literature and narrative.


In the **Logic** stage (junior high), students like to find out how all those facts fit together. They like to synthesize, analyze, and argue, identifying fallacies and presenting logical arguments.

In the **Rhetoric** stage (high school), students like to present themselves with polish. They like to write and speak with eloquence, using their words to persuade, to instruct, and to delight. These three stages of learning, as identified by Sayers, are another aspect of Classical education.


In all its levels, programs, and teaching, HCA seeks to:

- Teach all subjects as parts of an integrated whole with the Scriptures at the center (II Timothy 3:16-17).
- Provide a clear model of the biblical Christian life through our staff and board (Matthew 22:37-40).
- Encourage every student to begin and develop his or her relationship with God the Father through Jesus Christ (Matthew 28:18-20, Matthew 19:13-15).
